Notes for the Guidance of Authors

Progress in Reaction Kinetics is an international journal for the quarterly publication of both in-depth and current-awareness review articles. In-depth reviews should be comprehensive accounts bringing together work from many sources with the aim of providing an article of lasting value that will become established as the reference source in the particular subject. Current-awareness reviews, on the other hand, will normally focus on a relatively new or recently developed field or technique giving a state-of-the-art account of the subject and may well refer to a narrower range of existing work.

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The majority of articles will be full length contributions having a maximum length of 10 000 words, including space occupied by diagrams. The first page should include the authors' names, affiliations, details of the corresponding author including telephone, fax and e-mail numbers. A contents list containing all the heading and subheadings should be provided. A summary of up to 250 words is required and a list of up to ten keywords provided. The context should be established in the introduction. Three copies of the manuscript should be submitted. The author should retain a copy of the manuscript. Where possible, manuscripts submitted for publication should be accompanied by 3.5 or 5.25 inch floppy disks containing the text, tables and/or the figures. Disks can be either IBM PC compatible or Macintosh format. Authors should specify the word processing and graphics software used.
